1	<u>AIM Assessments</u> . A briefing paper outlined the difficulties in resourcing AIM assessments and treatment for young people with sexually abusive behaviour. Currently the YOS is only able to accept police referrals.	Dr Becky Morland 01733 864210
2	<u>Children's Trust Update</u> . John Richards has been working with the cabinet office to look at the future arrangements for commissioning Children's Services. 6	<u>Children who die unexpectedly</u> Dr Elaine Lewis introduced her report about the difficulties in finding paediatricians willing to examine a child who has died at home unexpectedly. If a child dies outside of the hospital, the Rapid Response duty rota would be the means to identify a paediatrician, Across Peterborough & Cambs, the rota consists of 5 nurses and 2 paediatricians. Simon Megicks explained that it is vitally important to have an immediate medical perspective on the cause of death as decisions about the need to safeguard siblings and/or initiate a criminal investigation require immediate action.
